I. COMPETITION OVERVIEW

The 2023 Skate Dallas competition will be conducted in accordance with the rules and regulations of U.S. Figure Skating, as set forth in the [current rulebook](#), as well as any pertinent updates that have been posted on the U.S. Figure Skating [website](#).

This competition is open to all eligible, restricted, reinstated or readmitted persons as defined by the Eligibility Rules. Skaters must be a currently registered member of a U.S. Figure Skating member club, Learn to Skate USA member, a collegiate club or an individual member in accordance with the current rulebook. For non-U.S. Citizens, please refer to the current [rulebook](#) for more information.

SERIES INFORMATION:

Skate Dallas 2023 is approved by U.S. Figure Skating as part of the 2023 Excel Series.

Skaters must register to participate in the **Excel Series** prior to competition at designated competitions in order to have their points recorded and seen in standings.

Skate Dallas 2023 is a qualifying event for the Adult Competition Series.

Adult 1-6, adult beginner, adult high beginner, adult pre-bronze and adult bronze program/free skate events that meet Adult Competition Series guidelines are offered at this competition. Adult Competition Series participants must submit a photo, scanned copy, email attachment or screenshot of the results sheet to adultcompetitionseries@gmail.com by the deadline published in the most recent [Adult Competition Series Handbook](#) to receive credit and series points.

DALLAS FSC TRI-SWIZZLE SERIES:

The **TriSwizzle Series** is for skaters in **Compete USA PROGRAM EVENTS** where skaters accumulate points from their placement and group size in SNOWPLOW SAM – FREESKATE 6 & INTRODUCTORY FREE SKATE levels.

TriSwizzle Series events include: 2022 Bunny Hop, 2023 Love Bug Open & 2023 Skate Dallas. Skaters must compete in all series competitions to be eligible. TRI-SWIZZLE Champions will be Announced July 2023.

II. ELIGIBILITY

TEST LEVEL:

Athletes may register based on their highest test passed as of the entry deadline OR the level of their EMS Series Application for the NQS or EXCEL series which will determine the athlete's competitive floor level. Skate Dallas competitors may skate UP one level from their completed FS test level if desired.

As of December 1, 2022, singles athletes may opt to accelerate their test progression within U.S. Figure Skating and thus compete at level(s) best suited for their technical skillset. Athletes must still meet the minimum requirements for each level and additionally, if participating within the National Qualifying Series (NQS) or National Excel Series (Excel), they will establish a competitive floor (i.e., the lowest level they can compete at).

The competitive floor is determined only by the level selected through the EMS Series Application for NQS or Excel and is not uniquely tied to competition registration (regardless of series participation).

Example, if an athlete passed their junior free skate test in November and competed in the 2022-23 NQS as a Novice from July - September, they may register for either novice or junior in excel or well-balanced events. The novice level will remain their competitive floor until they complete an EMS Series Application at the junior level or higher for NQS or Excel.

Example #2, if an athlete passed their juvenile free skate but has not competed in NQS or Excel (i.e., they have not established a competitive floor), they have the option to compete pre-preliminary – intermediate (if skate up is permitted). While the options are wide, U.S. Figure Skating entrusts the coach to guide the athlete to select the appropriate level for the athlete based on their technical skillset.

Eligibility Notes:

1. The singles free skate test levels will remain as a minimum requirement to compete.
2. Athletes may not skate down in any event.
3. This update does NOT apply to Adult, Showcase and Solo Dance.

Age restrictions/requirements:

Singles free skate events (well-balanced program) have the following requirements:

- Open Pre-Juvenile: Girls – 13 years or older; Boys – 14 years or older
- Pre-Juvenile: Girls – 12 years or younger; Boys – 13 years or younger
- Juvenile: Girls – 12 years or younger; Boys – 13 years or younger
- Open Juvenile: Girls – 13 years or older; Boys – 14 years or older
- Intermediate must be under the age of 18
- Adults must be 21 years or older

Skaters entering pre-juvenile and lower events will be divided as closely as possible by age should the number of entries warrant more than one group.

STANDARD EVENT LEVELS

EVENTS OFFERED AND ENTRY FEES:

Well Balanced Intermediate thru Senior will be a Combined Short Program and Freeskate event. Singles skaters may compete in **only one** Combined SP/Freeskate event and may also enter **1 separate** Short Program event for further experience. Final Rounds (performing the Free Skate program only) will be offered at the discretion of the chief referee if time permits and entries warrant for PrePreliminary thru Juvenile WB Freeskate events, and for Intermediate thru Senior WB Combined events based on initial round scores.

Critiques are available (reserved in advance for an extra fee of \$20) for selected IJS judged events. Please see critiques section below for detailed information and instructions.

Final Rounds will **NOT** be offered for Excel Levels as restricted by the 2023 Excel Series Rules.

***Note** –Open PreJuvenile is not considered part of the standard competition levels but is offered based on past demand. For event requirements Open PreJuvenile = PreJuvenile (please refer to Eligibility section for Open PreJuvenile age requirements).

Compete USA & Special Olympics
EVENTS OFFERED & ENTRY FEES

Basic Elements, Compulsory Elements, Basic Program, Freeskate, Showcase, and Special Olympics.

ELIGIBILITY/TESTING

To be eligible, skaters must be members of either the Compete USA Program and / or full members of U.S. Figure Skating. To be eligible, skaters must have submitted a membership application or be a member in good standing. Members of other organizations are eligible to compete but must be registered with the host Compete USA Program / Club or any other Compete USA Program / Club.

Eligibility will be based on skill level as of the closing date of entries. All Snowplow Sam and BASIC 1- 6 skaters must skate at highest level passed or one level higher, and **NO** official U.S. Figure Skating tests may have been passed including Moves in the Field, or individual dances.

For the Pre-FREESKATE thru FREESKATE 1-6, eligibility will be based only upon highest Compete USA Free Skate test level passed (Moves in the Field test will not determine skater's competitive level). Skaters may skate at highest level passed OR one level higher BUT not both levels in the same event during the competition.

The Special Olympics portion of this competition will be conducted in accordance with the Official U.S. Figure Skating Rule Book, the Special Olympics Winter Sports Rules, and the rules given in the announcement. The Special Olympian Competition is open to skaters 8 years or older who are receiving group or private instruction. Skaters must be registered as Special Olympians through the Special Olympics office.

Mandatory Athletes:

Athletes age 18+ as of the competition start date who will be competing on a team (i.e. synchro, dance, pairs, shadow dance, theatre, etc.) with at least one minor athlete must complete SafeSport™ training. *

Minor Athletes who turn 18 midseason are encouraged to seek parental consent to take the online SafeSport™ training early to avoid any disruptions in their ability to participate as the training is required upon turning 18. The athlete will not be SkateSafe® compliant until they have completed the training and their Members Only portal reflects completion. Please email skatesafe@usfigureskating.org for instructions or questions regarding parental consent.

U.S. Figure Skating Travel Policy:

All travel must strictly adhere to Two-Deep Leadership requirements. An Adult Participant cannot transport a Minor Athlete one-on-one and Two-Deep Leadership requirements must be adhered to at all times during In-Program travel, by transporting at least two minors or a second Adult Participant. An Adult Participant cannot share a hotel room or other sleeping arrangement with a Minor Athlete(s). IMPORTANT NOTICE FOR ALL COACHES:

To be an eligible coach at a nonqualifying competition, coaches must meet the applicable compliance requirements and verified by U.S. Figure Skating. Coach compliance falls into three categories, Coach/Choreographer, Learn to Skate USA Instructor, or Foreign Coach/Choreographer. Details regarding compliance requirements can be found [HERE](#). All compliance requirements must be met at the time of check-in to access the competition, no exceptions.

Coaches must be included within a skater's registration or updated through their EMS Skater Portal. All coaches declared at the time of registration will be included on the registration confirmation email. **Note:** There is no registration approval process within EMS as the data (membership and test level) is tied to the U.S. Figure Skating database. Non-compliant coaches will receive automated email reminders through the start of the competition.

Late entries can be considered for acceptance at the discretion of the competition committee only if accompanied by a \$35 late fee.

FOREIGN SKATERS:

Non-U.S. skaters intending to register for this competition must set up a non-member account prior to registering for the competition ([click here for HOW TO](#)). This can be done by choosing the "Create Account(Non-Member)" option on the [Members Only](#) login page.

PARTNERED EVENTS (PAIRS/DUETS/TRIOS):

Only one partner will complete registration for the team in EMS. During the registration process, you will be asked to identify your partner and verify their test information. **The registered partner will be responsible for managing all aspects of the competition for the team including music/PPC upload, practice ice sales, etc.**

TEST CREDIT:

Skaters that meet the requirements for test credit may request preparation of a test credit form at registration. Delay in printing of forms may occur if not requested a few hours prior to skating your event. Forms must be picked up at the registration desk prior to the end of the competition. Submission of test credit form to USFSA is the responsibility of the skater upon return home in conjunction with their home club test chair. Cost for test credit form preparation is \$20.

CRITIQUES

Skaters in Excel Freeski in levels Prelim Plus, PreJuv Plus & Juvenile thru Senior and skaters in Juvenile Well Balanced Freeski Events and in Intermediate thru Senior Well Balanced Combined events are offered the opportunity to have a critique with officials following their free skating events to provide useful feedback and help them fine tune their programs. For combined events, the critique is only for the Free Skating segment. Skaters may register for a critique online or in-person at the registration desk. Critique spaces are limited and critique registration will close when capacity is reached so early pre-registration is encouraged. Cost for critiques is \$20 each.

MUSIC SUBMISSION/UPLOAD:

Competitors participating in events utilizing music are required to upload their music to [EMS](#) no later than **May 25, 2023 11:59pm ET**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature and subject to a \$35 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

DEADLINE: MAY 25, 2023, 11:59PM ET; LATE FEE \$35

Competitors must also have available a backup copy of their competition music on either a CD or a USB drive, and it must be immediately available at rink side whenever the skater competes. Only one piece of music per device (CD / USB).

Planned Program Content (PPC):

Events judged with the **International Judging System (IJS)** require the submission of the Planned Program Content (**PPC**) form.

Competitors participating in IJS events are required to submit their PPC in [EMS](#) no later than **May 25, 2023 11:59pm ET**. After this date, skaters will be locked out of this feature in EMS and subject to a \$20 late fee. The late fee will automatically be added to each skater's cart who doesn't meet this requirement by the deadline. Late fees will not be removed under any circumstances and must be paid prior to receiving the skater credential onsite.

REFUND POLICY:

Entry fees will not be refunded after the deadline date, unless no competition exists or the event is canceled. **There will be no refunds for medical withdrawals.** The online processing fees are not refundable. Checks returned for non-sufficient funds and contested credit card charges will be issued a \$35 fee. Payment of the fee will be required before the skater is allowed to participate in practice ice or events.

There will be a \$35 fee for each change of event or level after the entry deadline date.

Full refunds, **minus the online processing fee**, are available if withdrawal is prior to the entry deadline.

IV. COMPETITION DETAILS

FACILITIES:

Credit Union of Texas Event Center & Allen Community Ice Rink is located at 200 East Stacy Road, Allen, TX 75002. Both ice surfaces are 200' x 85' with rounded corners.

LOCKER ROOMS AND CHANGING AREAS:

Locker rooms and changing areas will not be accessible during Skate Dallas 2023. Skaters should be prepared to dress off-site and arrive/depart from the arena ready (costumes, hair, make-up, etc.) in competition attire. Athletes will be provided with an area to put skates on but changing will not be permitted in these areas.

OFFICIAL NOTICES:

Notices will be posted online in EMS and on SkateDallas.org. It is the responsibility of each competitor, parent and coach to check frequently for any schedule changes and/or notices. Skaters are requested to arrive 45 minutes prior to the scheduled time of their event. A tentative schedule will be posted prior to the competition.

SCHEDULE:

Competitors may be scheduled on any day or time during the announced dates of the competition. The competition and practice ice schedule will be available after the close of entries. All participants will be notified via email once available.

PRACTICE ICE:

Practice Ice will be divided by level and skaters will be able to select/purchase those sessions appropriate for their entered events. Practice ice credit may be pre-purchased during registration online at the discounted price of \$18 for each 20 (twenty) minute session. Pre-paid practice ice is non-refundable and may not be sold to other skaters. Practice ice can only be purchased through [EMS](#) online or in person at the competition registration/PI desk. After the schedule is released online sessions will be sold for \$20 each session thru 6/7/2023. Once the Registration/ Practice Ice desk opens at the event, all remaining practice ice sessions will be sold for \$25 each session.

Premium event day warmup ice (middle of the day) will be scheduled if time permits and will be sold at the practice ice desk, and may be offered online after schedule is completed if space allows. NO MUSIC WILL BE PLAYED ON PREMIUM ICE.

Standard Event Level OFFICIAL PRACTICES (session where music is played, included with event fee) will be assigned beginning on Thursday, June 8th. Please plan your travel time to attend official practice day. The ability to play program music on other practice sessions will be on a first come-first serve basis as time permits and is NOT GUARANTEED.

Compete USA Practice Ice is not included with entry fee and is available for purchase separately. Compete USA practices will be held on Sunday, June 11th. No music will be played on Compete USA & Special Olympics practices.

Only uploaded music will be played on practice sessions. Please verify all uploaded music BEFORE the Music upload deadline.

ON-SITE REGISTRATION DESK:

See the event site located at www.skatedallas.org for registration desk open hours. Registration will be open from one before the first event and run through the last event of the day. The registration desk is located just inside the south entrance in the Arena Lobby and will open 30 minutes before the first practice ice session. Please register promptly upon arrival. Please note that Registration will **no longer accept any CDs**. If the skater's music was not uploaded or the uploaded version is not correct, the skater will provide their CD or USB to the Music person after their name has been called to skate and before they get into their starting position, and then collect the music before exiting the ice. ***Electronic devices, such as phones, for playing music will NOT be accepted.***

AWARDS:

Medals will be awarded to first, second, third and fourth place winners in all events. Ribbons will be awarded to fifth and sixth place winners. Trophies will be awarded to Pre-Preliminary, Preliminary, Pre-Juvenile, Juvenile, Intermediate, Novice, Junior, and Senior final round winners if number of entries warrant and time permits for final rounds to be held. All awards will be presented off-ice at the photographer's stand following each event.

The **DEBBIE BLOUNT MEMORIAL TROPHY** will be awarded to the skater placing 1st in the Intermediate Ladies Final Round. This trophy is given in memory of Debbie Blount (adult skater, mother of competitor Gabbie Blount, and a dedicated Dallas FSC volunteer).

The **CAROLYN HAMAN SPIRIT OF SKATE DALLAS AWARD** will be awarded to one skater in the Juvenile Ladies Final Round. The trophy is presented to the Juvenile level skater displaying the most potential through their music interpretation, performance, and musicality. It is the program upon completion; everyone would say, "I would love to see that program again!"

VOLUNTEERS:

There are a couple of options for flying into the Dallas area. DFW Airport which is approximately 37 miles from the Allen Event Center and Community Ice Rink. Another nearby airport is Love Field in Dallas which is approximately 30 miles from the arena.
